The Postdoctoral Teaching Fellowship is a multi-year teaching placement for academics interested in longer-term research and teaching in the United States.



MULTI-YEAR PLACEMENTS IN THE U.S.

Postdoctoral Teaching Fellows must teach at least four courses (three of which must be focused on modern Israel) and organize at least four Israel-related academic/community events each year.

Women, minorities, and individuals with disabilities are strongly encouraged to apply.

▼ REQUIREMENTS

- This program is open to Israeli scholars who possess Ph.D.s, have strong English skills, can teach classes about modern Israel, and are willing to be placed at universities in the United States.
- Candidates must be able to commit to three-year placements.
